1. Minutes were approved except for the vote on item #7. There were 6 in favor and one abstention.
2. Warrant - agreed budget to be \$1475, and the usual article that any unused funds from the appropriation be voted into the conservation fund. ^{John} reported household hazardous waste would again be under the dump budget. Cost will be \$2400 this year, based on usage rather than town population. It was agreed to request the Selectmen to put in a warrant article for \$1500 for repair of the steps on the Great Hill Tower.
3. Septics - Weymouth. The Planning Board has approved a waiver for the installation of the tank which 2s needed.
4. Dredge and Fill. Roy Hammond, forest minimum impact, for two culverts. Kate Thompson, application by Scott Aspinall, Bartlett Mill Road, forestry minimum impact.

Four forms of dredge and fill application were listed:

Forestry minimum impact - permitted if area is less than 50' in length. TCC way site check, but doesn't need to,

Minimum impact, such as a driveway crossing, if less than 3000' of fill. Minor, has less than 20,000 ft. of fill. TCC should site check and report to Wetlands Board, which usually issues a blanket approval, rather than treat either of these categories individually.

Major - anything over 20,000 ft. of fill, Treated individually, and may have bearing. TCC site check and report to Wetlands Board.

5. Violation - Ray Marsh. Peg has written Wetlands Board and received no answer. They say they have never received it. She will write again, send it registered mail, and also keep a copy.
6. Complaint on dredge and fill - forestry minimum impact culvert, Fowlers Kill Road, water building an ice dam and overflowing into mad. Peg will check the application, which came in last fall and report at March Meeting. If culvert it is to be permanent it needs to be installed better.
7. Wetlands Board. TCC's help has been asked to inform Tam Clerk and applicants that dredge and fill application forms have been changed. N. H. A. C. C. has suggested a form for reporting to Wetlands Board. Copies of the form will go out with these minutes.
Surface and Groundwater Committee has not met yet in regard to guidelines for granting waivers.
Digital mapping - Peter has written Fay Rubin - no reply as yet.
Jackman North - Chris has sent the Wetlands Board all the information he has, and expects to be notified soon of the public hearing, at which he will testify.
8. Perkins Easement. Ned has written the Community School in regard to plans for cutting - no answer as yet. The School is putting in trails and TCC plans a trail through the area as authorized in the easement. It was agreed communications with the School should be kept open as to activities within the area.
9. Scenic Roads. Public Service has written the Selectmen as to the town scenic roads ordinance, as it is planning some trimming along roads. Peg has given Selectmen the information, and has answered the PSNH letter.
10. Environmental Ordinances - Town. The new draft made by Ned was reviewed and a few changes made. There was discussion of the best means of informing

10. Environmental Ordinances (cont.) newcomers, to town, and others, of these ordinances, and also of publicizing activities and purposes of TCC.
11. NHACC - Revised Handbook pages. These have come and were given to each member. One complete copy has come and Betty will deliver it to Nat Steele.
12. Conferences.

VOTE I - Any TCC member who wishes to go to programs sponsored by the Society for Protection of N. H. Forests, as recently listed, is authorized to do so and may submit a bill for costs to the Treasurer. (Moved by Ned, seconded by Lori. Unanimous.)

13. TCC Members. Agreed to request Selectmen to reappoint John Mersfelder and Chris Conrod, as they replaced Peg and Betty on the Commission and these terms expired 1992.
