Meeting - May 9, 1994

PRESENT: John Mersfelder, Chris Conrod, Ned Beecher, Peg King, Betty Steele
ABSENT: Loralie Gerard, Nat Steele, Mike Johnson

1. Minutes of previous meeting were approved.
2. Easements. Ned reported four posts for the two signs had been bought at a cost of \$54.72. It was hoped that the Boy Scouts might put them in.
Chris has met with Eric Anderson and Rudy Carlson on the site and walked the trail. There is not enough work required for this to meet Eric's project guidelines. Chris suggested he work on a treadway on Jackman North, where it passes over the stump dump near the gravel pit, and perhaps put up sign posts, as the trail is hard to follow at this spot.
There was discussion of color of paint for TCC trails and it was felt this should be consistent for any one trail system, though not necessarily so for separate TCC trails.
Chris will ask Eric for a time schedule for the signs. It was agreed there should be some publicity. Eric will do a write up on the work.
3. Wetlands - dredge and fill. The Remick Estate has applied to construct a farm pond, east of Great Hill Road and above the house and horse barn. Chris and John have looked at it and recommend approval - Chris will write it up.
4. Wetlands - incomplete application. The Wetlands Board has said the application of Skandia North is still incomplete - it needs a detailed plan.
5. Minimum impact - Margaret Kennedy (near junction of Page Hill Road at Tamworth Village end and Route 113). Wetlands Board says application incomplete, but David Welch has said they sent all information needed. He will get in touch with the Board and try to straighten out the problem.
Minimum impact - John Hayford, tax map 410, Lot 61. Application is O.K. Work to be done by Green leaf Products.
6. Lilacs. John has dug up six good sized lilacs at the County Farm and has them at his house. Ned will make arrangements with the school to put them in. There should be a photo op of this.
7. Dredge and fill, possible violation. Willie Farnum has asked that TCC check into fill put in in back of South Tamworth Fire Station some time ago. Chris has checked the site and based on vegetation it might or might not be classified as wetland. It would need further delineation to determine status. It was agreed that John would call David Bowles, fire chief, to let him the legal situation; he may want to have a delineation made and if it proves to be a wetland an after the fact application could be made.
8. Tin Mt. - Forests for the Future, 8th Grade. Ned said Dick Fortin had asked for ideas of locations for this project for another year. Suggestions were: Bolles Preserve, of Nature Conservancy; Clark Preserve of Chocorua Lake Conservation Foundation; Thompson Preserve of N. H. Fish and Game. It was agreed Tin Mt. probably would not wish to use private land for the project. It was reported that Neely Lanou was now president of Chocorua Lake Conservation Foundation.
