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DRAFT MINUTES - MEETING APRIL 8, 1996

PRESENT: John Persfelder, Chris Conrod, Roy Ames, Charlie Townsend,  
Betty Steele. John Roberts - Selectman.

1. Minutes of the March meeting were approved with one change. Item #9 should state that Sheldon Perry should be asked for an estimate for replacement of the Aspinall sign.
2. Members. Roy Ames has been appointed for a three year term to the Commission, Charlie Townsend has been reappointed for a three year term, and Betty Steele as an alternate for a three year term. All have been sworn in by the Town Clerk.
3. Planning Board. Willie Farnum has resigned from the Planning Board. It was agreed to ask the Planning Board for another representative.
4. Wetlands - HB 1597. Chris has written State Senator Johnson, as agreed at the March meeting, and gave John a copy of the letter.
5. Wetlands Board has written to seek inventory of development proposals or project in prime Wetlands. There have only been two - the Lindsay case, and the TCC proposal for a board walk, for both of which the Wetlands Board has full documentation.
6. Biosludge. John and Charlie are going on Thursday to the Annual Meeting of the Conservation District. Biosludge will be one of the topics. John has talked with Nat who reported that Hank LeTarte is interested in working with the town on his project. There is legislation pending re notification of abutters when biosludge is to be used. After some discussion it was felt that not enough is known about it, and the need is to be educated. After the Thursday meeting John and Charlie will report to the Planning Board and Selectmen.
7. Recycling committee. Charlie Townsend was reappointed to the committee. John Roberts reported that the Town would have to charge for large items brought to the dump such as mattresses, furniture, etc., although there has not been a final decision yet.
8. General information. The Enoch Remick House has been nominated<sup>a</sup> as a National Historic Building. Word has been received re Conservation Camp, from Soc. for the protection of N H Forests. Although TCC has in the past given scholarships, this has been discontinued, for lack of applicants. It was felt that if a good application was received the scholarship might be re-instated.
9. By-Laws. Charlie and John will draft something for the May meeting.
10. Great Hill Tower. Roy will install the needed metal bar as soon as the weather breaks.
11. Future plans - republish TCC trail guide after updating it; work on TCC plan; print new supply of Hemenway Guides - check with Lori as to need.
